

A Guide to the Multiple Measurements Rating (MMR):

Every year, the Minnesota Department of Education gives a Multiple Measurements Rating (MMR) to each school. The MMR measures school performance in the areas of proficiency, growth, achievement gap reduction and graduation rates.

MMR Score Focus Areas

Schools receive up to 25 points for each of their focus areas, with the highest scores being 75 total points for Elementary and Middle Schools and 100 points for High Schools.

Each fall schools are given their total points out of 75 (Elementary/Middle) or 100 (High School). Schools that have Title 1 funding may receive special designations based on their scores. For schools with high scores compared to other Title 1 funded schools they may receive a designation of Reward or Celebration. For schools with low scores compared to other Title 1 funded schools they may receive a designation of Continuous Improvement, Focus, or Priority.

Schools that received a lower MMR score and receive a designation are provided more support from their district and from the Minnesota Department of Education in the form of professional development, data training, and focused planning time for school improvement.
